**RULES FOR DETERMINING POST SEASON QUALIFIERS
RULES OF PLAY FOR POST SEASON**

I. Majors Division Championship Series

American League Champion v. National League Champion

The DMLL Majors Division Champion shall be determined by a best two out of three game **Majors Division Championship Series** between the American League Champion and the National League Champion. This series shall be played at the conclusion of the regular season and immediately following completion of the American League Championship Tournament and National League Championship Tournament (as defined in Section II, below).

- A. The home team for the Majors Division Championship Series shall be determined as follows:
1. If the DMLL Home Run Competition is held during the regular season then the team representing the Home Run Competition winning league shall be the home team for games 1 and 3 and the visitor in game 2.
 2. If no DMLL Home Run Competition is held during the regular season, then the team with the better overall winning percentage in the regular season shall be the home team for games 1 and 3 and the visitor in game 2.
 - a. In the event neither team has a better overall winning percentage in the regular season, the winner in head to head play shall be home team for games 1 and 3 and the visitor in game 2.
 - b. If head to head play does not break this tie then the home team for games 1 and 3 shall be determined by a coin toss before game 1.

II. League Championship Tournaments

Triple Elimination Tournament Format

The American League Champion and the National League Champion shall each be determined by league wide championship tournament.

- A. At the conclusion of the regular season, there will be a triple elimination tournament in each of the American League (the "American League Championship Tournament") and National League (the "National League Championship Tournament") to determine the respective League Champions.

B. All teams in each of the American and National Leagues shall play in their respective League Championship Tournaments.

C. The seeding for these tournaments shall be determined as follows:

1. Teams will be seeded by regular season winning percentage (i.e. the team with the best overall record in winning percentage will be the first seed).
Winning percentage is calculated as follows: total # of wins / total games played.
Tie games count as 0.5 wins for this calculation.
2. If two teams have the same regular season winning percentage the following tie breakers will apply in descending order:
 - Head to head play
 - Intra-league record (winning percentage of games played against other teams within a teams own league)
 - Total Runs allowed during the regular season
 - Total Runs scored during the regular season
 - Coin toss
3. If three or more teams are tied for the same regular season winning percentage the following tie breakers will apply in descending order:
 - Intra-league record (winning percentage of games played against other teams within a teams own league)
 - Total Runs allowed during the regular season
 - Total Runs scored during the regular season
4. If teams are still tied after applying all tiebreakers then the Division Coordinator shall supervise a blind draw that will result in remaining teams being designated to their respective seeding.

D. The home team in each of the League Championship Tournament games shall be determined as follows:

1. The team with the higher ranked seeding at the start of the tournament shall be the home team.

III. Postseason Tournament Rules

All Postseason games will be played according to the current 'Official Regulations and Playing Rules of Little League Baseball' (aka the "Green Book") unless specifically noted in the following.

- A. During league pre-season, regular season and post-season games pitchers must adhere to the following rest requirements:
- If a player pitches 66 or more pitches in a day, four (4) calendar days and one game of rest must be observed.
 - If a player pitches 51 - 65 pitches in a day, three (3) calendar days and one game of rest must be observed.
 - If a player pitches 41 - 50 pitches in a day, two (2) calendar days and one game of rest must be observed.
 - If a player pitches 36 - 40 pitches in a day, two (2) calendar days of rest must be observed.
 - If a player pitches 21-35 pitches in a day, one (1) calendar day of rest must be

- observed.
- If a player pitches 1-20 pitches in a day, no calendar day of rest is required.
- B. A player may not pitch in more than one game in a day. A pitcher who delivers 41 or more pitches in a game cannot play the position of catcher for the remainder of that day.
- C. A 10 run mercy rule will be in effect. The losing team must bat four times. Games will not have a run rule limit per inning.
- D. The postseason tournaments will be played according to current Little League regular season bat 9 rules of play with the following modification:
Minimum Play: Two innings defensively (does not need to be consecutive) and one at bat .
- E. Tie games must be continued. Any tie games that are suspended because of darkness will be scheduled to complete prior to advancement to the next tournament game.
- F. Teams must start and finish the game with 9 players per Little League rules. Failure to do so will result in forfeit of that game
- G. Teams are expected to enter the tournament with their roster at full strength (i.e. 12 players) unless otherwise authorized the DMLL Board of Directors
- H. Teams with only 8 or 9 active players available from their regular roster at game time may bring up 1 player from a lower division team to play in that specific game, for a maximum of 10 active players at game time. The player brought up to play cannot pitch.
- I. Discipline and good sportsmanship shall be maintained at all times. This applies to dugouts as well as stands. Managers are responsible for the conduct of players, coaches, and parents/fans. If a manager, coach, spectator, or player is ejected from a game, he/she must immediately leave the playing and spectator areas. Failure to do so will result in a forfeit. Ejection from a game will result in suspension from the remainder of the tournament.

Home Team:

- The home team will prep the field and put all equipment out including bases, etc.
- The home team will occupy the first base dugout.
- The home team supplies at least three game balls.
- The home team will keep the official scorebook.
- The home team will designate an official pitch count recorder who is responsible for maintaining the official pitch counts for all pitchers
- The home team manager is responsible for inputting the official score, pitch count, and player absences upon being prompted to do so by an email that is sent out by the league.

Visiting Team:

- The visiting team will be responsible for the field breakdown, putting all equipment away, repairing holes on the pitching mound, repairing the batters' box, and

- cleaning up trash.
- The visiting team will occupy the third base dugout.
- The visiting team should supply at least two game balls as backup.
- The visiting team will keep a scorebook for itself.
- The visiting team will keep a pitch count for all pitchers.

IV. District 31 Tournament of Champions

For the District 31 Tournament of Champions (“TOC”), DMLL will send a team from the National League and a team from the American League as its representatives. For each league, the team that will advance to TOC shall be the team that wins the League Championship Tournament.

If a District 31 Tournament of Champions is not held this year, then team that wins the League Championship Tournament will play in the Coast Cities Tournament. (See section V. Coast Cities Tournament below)

V. Coast Cities Tournament

DMLL will send three teams from each of the American League and National League to represent DMLL in the Coast Cities Tournament. The three teams from each league will be determined as follows:

- The team that loses to the League Champion in the final game of the League Championship Tournament will represent DMLL as the 1st seed.
- The team that wins the final game of the consolation bracket of the League Championship Tournament will represent DMLL as the 2nd Seed.
- The team that loses the final game of the consolation bracket of the League Championship Tournament will represent DMLL as the 3rd Seed.

If a District 31 Tournament of Champions is not held this year, DMLL will send to the Coast Cities Tournament three teams from each league as follows:

- The team that wins the League Championship Tournament will represent DMLL as the 1st seed.
- The team that loses to the League Champion in the final game of the League Championship Tournament will represent DMLL as the 2nd Seed.
- The team that wins the final game of the consolation bracket of the League Championship Tournament will represent DMLL as the 3rd Seed.
